LOOK FOR BOATS AT LAUMEIER

Laumeier Sculpture Park presents

Carlos Zamora: cART, a series of mobile golf cart sculptures, July 25—December 22

Laumeier Sculpture Park will present *Carlos Zamora: cART* as the 2019 installment of the Kranzberg Exhibition series, committed to supporting and showcasing local artists. Cuban-born, St. Louis-based illustrator and graphic designer Carlos Zamora will retrofit the Park's golf carts to transform them into kinetic sculptures. Golf carts play a pivotal role in how Laumeier staff crisscrosses the campus, shuttling colleagues, equipment, and occasionally, visitors. Zamora has created a unique set of artworks by enveloping the carts in printed vinyl wraps, sculptural frameworks, and ornamentation inspired by a variety of sources such as Cuban car culture, nursery rhymes, history and politics.

Zamora's commissioned designs are inspired by the Cuban song "Barquito de papel" (Little Paper Boat), a tune about hope and peace that children sing all over the Spanish-speaking world. Written in the 1940s, the song describes a paper boat as well as a child's wishes to travel, make friends and live in a world without war. The origami-style boat brings to mind many metaphors and messages, such as duality of innocence and hardship, hope and friendship, difference and desperation. Zamora will create three paper boat-style sculptures, installed as cart canopies, and one large boat placed along a woodland creek in Laumeier's Art Hike Trail.

Laumeier Curator Dana Turkovic states: "Zamora's project is the latest of Laumeier's efforts to blur and extend the boundaries of contemporary sculpture by producing a new kind of graphic sculpture that traverses the Park and activates our cultural and physical landscape, while also raising our audience's awareness of the rich cultural tradition and history of Cuban arts."

Multiple public programs will be presented in conjunction with this project, including:

Zamora. Zamora (b. 1978, Havana, Cuba) has lived in the United States since 2006. He holds a degree from Havana Design Institute. His designs and illustrations have been published world-wide by *Opus Habana*, *Anales del Caribe*, the *New York*

Observer, The Boston Globe, The Wall Street Journal, and many more.

About Laumeier Sculpture Park


